

## Scriptural Prayers while doing Satin Hands:

*(I pick one verse for each step and maybe expand on it a little bit while they are rubbing that step into their hands, then you can pick one for a concluding reflection or do one of the scented ones if using the new Peach scented Satin hands!)*

Psalm 143:6 “I stretch out my hands to you; my soul thirsts for you like a parched land.”

Psalm 63:4 “Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. So I will bless you as long as I live; I will lift up my hands and call on your name.”

Psalm 141:1-2 “I call upon you, O LORD; come quickly to me; give ear to my voice when I call to you. Let my prayer be counted as incense before you, and the lifting up of my hands as an evening sacrifice.

Psalm 90:17 “Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands-- O prosper the work of our hands!”

Psalm 47:1-2 “Clap your hands, all you peoples; shout to God with loud songs of joy. For the LORD, the Most High, is awesome, a great king over all the earth.”

Add a fragrance by using a Private Spa lotion with Satin Hands, or just as a lotion, foot wash or scrub as we minister to the homebound, hospitalized, or infirm.
